**Dear Parents and Carers** 

Welcome back. We hope you had a lovely half term break. We have already been making special boats to read books in. We have also been exploring objects that float and sink.

#### **Our Topic**

Term 6: The Sea

We aim to learn all about visiting the seaside, exploring different sea creatures and have some of our own pirate adventures. We also have our school trip to look forward to.

#### Reading

Please remember to read and discuss the book your child brings home so they are able to talk about it at nursery. Books should be brought to nursery every week on Monday or Tuesday to be changed.

## <u>PE</u>

We will be continuing our PE activities as practise for going into Reception in September. More recently we have been getting excited about our sports day event. We will practise PE either in the school hall or on the field. Please provide your child with a PE kit, consisting of a sweatshirt/hooded top, t-shirt, socks, plimsolls/trainers, shorts/leggings/tracksuit bottoms as we will be changing for PE. Every item needs to be clearly labelled and in a bag that will remain in school every day. Kits will be taken home to be washed at the end of each term.

## Warmer weather

As the weather is getting warmer, children will begin to bring hats into nursery. Please ensure that these are clearly named. Sun cream must not be brought into school as it cannot be applied at nursery. If necessary, sun cream should be applied at home before coming to nursery.

#### **Outdoor play**

There are lots of benefits to learning outdoors. Not only do children enjoy it, it provides them with the

freedom to get out of the classroom and explore the world around them. It is inevitable that when young children are playing outside that they may get wet and muddy. We strongly recommend that a spare set of clothes is kept in nursery in case too much fun is had. We still recommend wellies as the best outdoor footwear and they should be kept in nursery.

# HOW YOU CAN SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING THIS TERM:

- Encourage your child to dress and undress themselves independently. They may like to create their own routine for getting changed. Sometimes buttons need a little support, however, you may be surprised by what your child can do by themselves!
- In preparation for learning how to read and write, you could try to sound-talk words to your child. e.g. "Can you go and fetch me your h-a-t?" "Where is your b-a-g?" This will help the children to begin to hear individual sounds in words for themselves and they may be able to have a go at this too.
- The children are getting very good at counting groups of objects. You may now like to try some number recognition activities with your child. Look out for numbers together in the shops, on till receipts, menus, calendars and car number plates. You will have lots of numbers around the house to find too!
