<p><u>Green Group</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Greatest chance of academic success. More opportunities to enhance life skills. Allows children to maximise their potentials. Children could receive Kirts to spend in the shop. Trophies, certificates and unique prizes may be earned. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> No concerns from the school. The child attends between 98% - 100% of the time. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> More knowledge acquired. Improved social skills. Children will be proud. Pupils will feel they have achieved.
<p><u>Amber Group</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Achieving success becomes a little harder. Attendance awards cannot be achieved for the whole year. A child's potential to learn is lessened. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Concerns from the school. The child attends between 90-98% of the time. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Child's attendance discussed by class teacher with parent / carer. Parents may be invited to meet with the school's attendance panel. Support put in place for the parent / carer.
<p><u>Red Group</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Very hard for your child to achieve. Potential fines for parents. Possibility of court proceedings for parents. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Extreme concern from the school about a child's health and / or attendance. Child attends less than 90% of the time. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Attendance panel could make contact to complete an Early Help Assessment. Outside agencies may become involved with the family. Targets could be set for attendance. The courts are able to fine parents up to £2500 and can sentence parents to imprisonment for up to three months for their child's non-attendance at school.
