









Science key knowledge to be transferred to long term memory

	As scientists we will learn about:	You will remember
	Water, food and air are the basic needs of animals and humans.	In Year 1, you learnt that plants need water, sunlight and the right temperature to survive.
	Animals and humans have offspring that grow into adults.	In Reception, you learnt that a caterpillar changes into a butterfly.
	Baby, toddler, child, teenager, adult and elderly person are the stages of growing up.	In Reception, you learnt who your family are and who lives in your home.
	A baby and child walk, eat and communicate differently.	In Reception, you learnt that vegetables and fruit are healthy and chocolate is unhealthy.

	You can catch balls using both hands or one hand. Catching larger balls is easier and catching smaller balls is harder.	In Year 1, you learnt to improve your throwing and catching skills while playing 'Bag in the Well' and 'Wall Target'.
	You can balance and travel around a space using different body heights and positions to make your sequence interesting.	In Reception, you learned to travel like a monkey, bunny, and frog.
