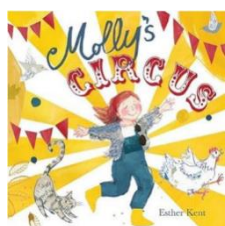

Welcome back to Term 6. We hope you have had an enjoyable break.

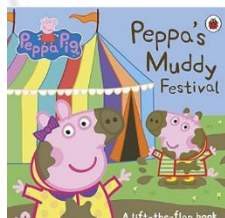
Our Theme

Our theme this term is 'Showtime'. We will be exploring the different ways we can express ourselves, whether it be through acting, dancing, singing, art, dressing up or cooking.



Each week we shall explore different themes including going on holiday, puppets as well as camping and festivals. Alongside many learning

activities there will be lots of role play opportunities such as going to the theatre, the beach, the circus and a water park.



We will also have our Sports Day which will be another way to express 'Showtime'.

We will be revisiting last term's theme Woodlands with an exciting trip to Baytree Owl and Wildlife Centre.

In phonics, we will be consolidating our knowledge of s, a, t, p, i and n, as well as the letters in our names and days of the week. During literacy sessions, we will continue to identify rhyming words.

Please ensure that all your child's belongings are clearly named.

This term the children will start to have PE lessons. All children require a PE kit which needs to be left

at Nursery. This simply needs to be a t-shirt, a pair of shorts and a pair of trainers. Please ensure that all items are labelled clearly with your child's name and is in a separate bag from your child's school bag.

Please continue to share books with your child, to read and reread stories. Talk about the characters and storyline, link or compare what has happened to events in your life, consider alternative endings or make predictions about what might happen next. We have really enjoyed looking at the wonderful pictures and stories you have added to your reading journals. We will continue to change the books once a week.

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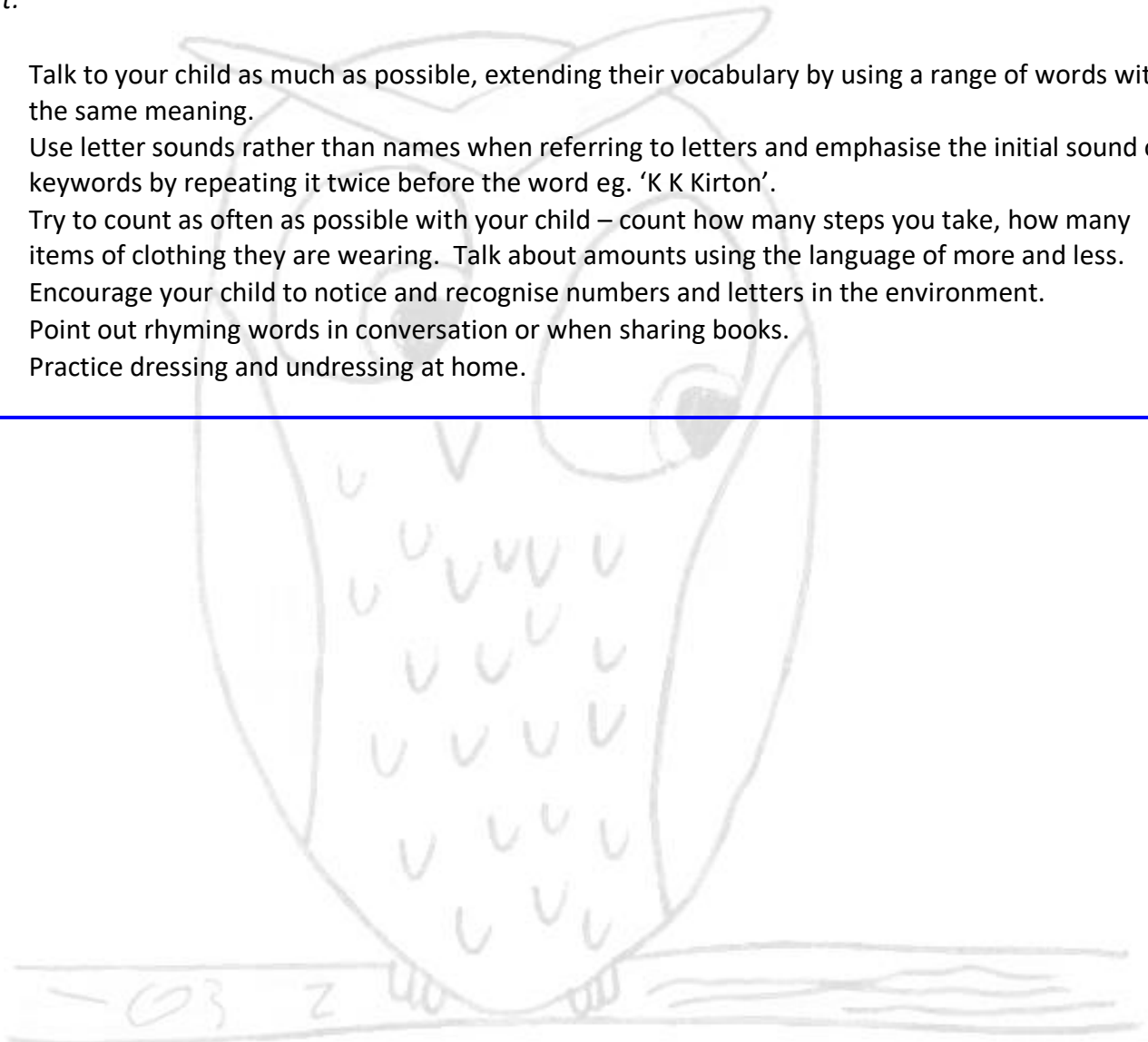

HOW YOU CAN SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING THIS TERM:

Key things that parents can do to support their child this term related to things they will be learning about:

- Talk to your child as much as possible, extending their vocabulary by using a range of words with the same meaning.
- Use letter sounds rather than names when referring to letters and emphasise the initial sound of keywords by repeating it twice before the word eg. 'K K Kirton'.
- Try to count as often as possible with your child – count how many steps you take, how many items of clothing they are wearing. Talk about amounts using the language of more and less.
- Encourage your child to notice and recognise numbers and letters in the environment.
- Point out rhyming words in conversation or when sharing books.
- Practice dressing and undressing at home.



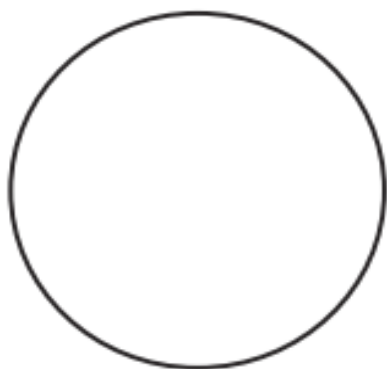
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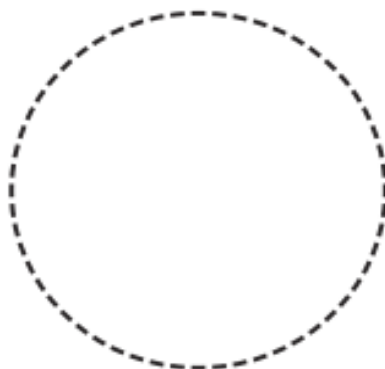


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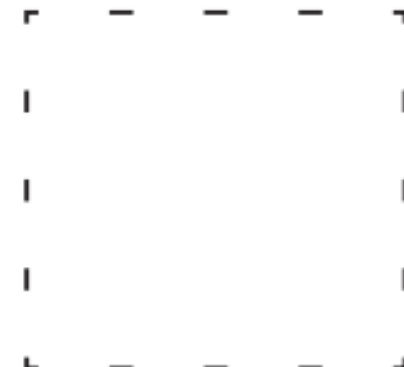
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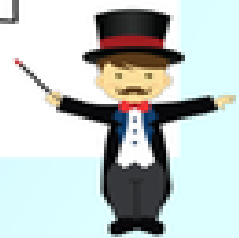


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My Favourite Circus Character



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Talk to a grown-up at home about how to stay safe in the sun.



Draw a picture of somewhere that you would like to spend a holiday. Use your imagination...it can be anywhere, real or imaginary!



When you are playing outside, look at your shadow. Is it as big as you or smaller? Is it always the same size? Does it always follow you or does it sometimes move in front of you? Find out as much as you can about your shadow and then tell us about it!



During the summer, it is nice to cool down our drinks with ice cubes. Make some ice at home; you could draw some pictures to tell us how you did it.

Draw a picture of a flower with 8 petals. Colour 4 petals red. How many petals have you got left? You can choose another colour for these petals.



Can you think of 5 words that start with the sound 's'? Draw a picture of each one and write the word underneath.
