#### **HOW YOU CAN SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING THIS TERM:**

- On winter mornings, the ground often looks white with frost. Ask a grown-up to help you investigate the frost and find out what it is and where it comes from.
- Using everyday objects, ask your child which sounds do these start with and whether they can hear the first sounds in other words.
- Help an adult to measure ingredients for baking or cooking following a recipe.

Plan a tea party on the moon for the aliens. You could draw pictures of the food you want at the party. Think about what kind of food an alien might like - star biscuits, rocket jelly or moon cheese balls, the possibilities are endless!



Create a vehicle that you could use to travel into space. What would it look like? You could create a rocket using cardboard tubes, a spacecraft using old boxes or you could design a different type of vehicle to get you there!

## **Edible Sparklers**

#### Ingredients

Breadsticks

Slab of milk or dark chocolate (for melting)

1 tbsp of honey

Cake sprinkles

Hundreds and thousands

#### Equipment

Microwavable bowl or saucepan

Microwave or hob

Wooden spoon

Tablespoon

Bowls for dipping

Jug

#### Method

- With the help of an adult, melt the chocolate in a microwavable bowl in the microwave or over the hob in a saucepan.
- Add some honey to the chocolate so that it stays runny for longer!
- Dip the end of your breadstick into the runny chocolate.
- Cover the chocolatey end with sprinkles and hundreds and thousands.
- Leave the chocolate to set by standing the breadstick (chocolate end up) in a jug.
- 6. When set, enjoy eating your edible sparkler!






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
### Draw the Weather





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
