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HOW YOU CAN SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING THIS TERM:

Key things that parents can do to support their child this term related to things they will be learning about:

- Talk to your child as much as possible, correcting them if they mispronounce a word
- Try to count as often as possible with your child counting the number of steps you take, counting items of clothing or quantities of food
- Encourage your child to write the first letter of their name
- Encourage independence with clothing putting on shoes and coats, pulling up trousers



Go for a walk with a grownup. What letters and numbers can you see on the number plates of parked cars? Can you see any letters of your name? Can you spot numbers 1 to 5? Can you draw a picture of a bus with 5 windows? Have you been on a bus ride? Where would you like to go on a bus? Tell a grown-up about a bus journey you would like to take.



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Can you spot all of these items on a winter scavenger hunt? Tick them off as you find them!

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During Chinese New Year celebrations, children are sometimes given envelopes with money inside! With an adult, look at some coins together. Can you find the biggest coin? Can you find the smallest coin? Can you make rubbings of the coins? What can you see on them?



Red is a lucky colour during Chinese New Year. Do you have anything red in your home? Can you find different red objects? What are they? You could use a camera and take photos of them!



There are 3 red lanterns and 2 yellow lanterns hanging in a row. How many lanterns are there altogether? Can you show this on your fingers?



Make a model dragon. You could use cardboard tubes and boxes, playdough, construction toys or natural materials (like leaves and pebbles). You could draw a picture or take a photo of your dragon model.
