

The Dinosaur Has Lost His Spikes - Can you help?

- Cut out the triangles. Remember you should always be able to see your thumb when you are using scissors. Ask your child to name the shapes and count the number of sides. If your child needs help to cut or guide the paper it is easiest to sit behind them and put your arms around them. Encourage your child to open and close the scissors in a smooth controlled action.
- Stick the triangles along the dinosaur's tail and back. Start at the end of the tail with the smaller triangles and use the bigger ones along the back.
- Finger paint your dinosaur using 1 finger and a dabbing action. I suggest using green and brown but any colours would work.
- Count the number of spikes on the back of your dinosaur.
- Are there more big spikes, more small spikes or are there the same number?
