








Science key knowledge to be transferred to long term memory		
	As scientists, we will learn about:	You will remember:
	Seeds need water and a suitable temperature to germinate. Most seeds do not need light or soil to germinate.	In Reception, you read the story 'The Tiny Seed' to learn that a seed can grow into a plant.
	A bulb grows roots and then a shoot.	In Year 1, you learnt that a main root is called a 'tap root'.
	Some seeds take longer to grow than others. They can be different sizes and colours.	In Year 1, you explored the Coronation Garden to identify cornflowers and snowdrops which are wild plants.
	Plants that are not watered will wilt and eventually die. Plants that do not have light will continue to grow at first, but they eventually die.	In Year 1, you learnt that plants need water, light and the right temperature to survive.

	Digital music is made using a computer. A computer can copy the sound made by instruments and put them together to make a piece of music.	In Year 1, you learnt how to animate and add sound to a story using the 2Create a Story tool.

	Dances can be made using actions such as turning, jumping and travelling. You can change the speed and size of dance movements.	In Reception, you used a simple movement dance to tell the story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'.
	Passing in different directions, finding a space and avoiding opponents can help to defend against another player.	In Year 1, you learnt to pass a ball through a hoop and under a 'bridge'.

	Christians believe everyone should be treated as special and equal.	In Year 1, you learnt the story of 'The Good Samaritan' about taking care of others.
