








Science key knowledge to be transferred to long term memory

	As scientists we will learn about:	You will remember
	The two main types of habitats are land habitats and water habitats.	In Reception, you learnt that sheep, cows and pigs live on farms. This is a land habitat.
	All animals eat plants or other animals. Food chains show how animals get food.	In Year 1, you learnt that cows are herbivores so eat plants.
	All animals have a lifecycle which shows the different stages of their life. Animals have babies in their lifecycle that look similar to their parents.	In Reception, you read the 'Hungry Caterpillar' to learn that a caterpillar turns into a butterfly.
	All living things need food, water, and air to survive.	In Reception, you read 'Handa's Surprise' and learnt that fruits and vegetables are healthy foods that can help us to survive.

	I Wanna Play in a Band is a rock song. A simple melody can be composed using different instruments.	In Year 1, you learnt to compose a melody with the notes C and D on the glockenspiel for the song 'Zootime'.

	As athletes we will learn about:	You will remember
	Bounce, freeze and melt movements can be joined together to make a dance.	In Year 1, you learnt to join stretching movements to create a dance using streamers.
	Throwing, kicking and bouncing a ball to each other in a game can help avoid interception (where the other team steals the ball).	In Year 1, you learnt that games can be made easier or harder by changing the rules.

	We will learn about:	You will remember
	The Qur'an guides Muslims on how to live their lives. The Shahadah is believing Allah is the one true God. Zakat is giving charity to those less fortunate.	In Year 1 you learned that Muslims express their beliefs through a festival called Ramadan.
