Out of the Window		Wind comes from all directions. The wind gets its name from the direction it blows from. East wind comes from the east.	In Reception, you learnt that you might need to wear a fleece to keep warm when it is windy.

	Predictions can be made about the weather by looking at clouds and clear skies. This is called a weather forecast.	In Year 1, you learnt that symbols are used to show different types of weather.			When our part of the Earth is tilted (leans) closer to the sun, it is warmer. When it is tilted further away from the sun, it is colder.	In Year 1, you learnt we live on planet Earth.
	Weather forecasters predict the weather so we can think about what we might wear or what we might do that day.
