







SCIENCE Key knowledge to be transferred to long term memory		
	As scientists, we will learn about:	You will remember:
	The digestive system consists of the mouth, oesophagus, stomach, small intestine, large intestine, rectum and anus.	In Year 2, you learnt that animals, including humans, need food, water and air to survive.
	Humans have two sets of teeth – milk teeth and permanent teeth.	In Year 3, you learnt that we have a skeleton and the muscles in our bodies help us move. Teeth are part of the skeleton.
	Food chains show what is eaten by different animals.	In Year 1, you learnt that carnivores eat meat, herbivores eat plants and omnivores eat both.

balanced diet	A balanced diet involves eating the right amount of food from the different food groups.	You might like to read these books:  Food chains by Sally Morgan  Teeth by Nick Arnold
carbohydrates	Bread, cereals, pasta and rice are mostly carbohydrates. You need them to give you energy.	
consumer	An animal in a food chain that eats something.	
fats	Foods from animals, such as meat, milk, and eggs, all contain fats. Fats fuel the body and help absorb some vitamins.	
fibre	Fibre is only found in plant foods such as cereals, cereal based foods, fruits and vegetables. Fibre slows down digestion and helps us to stay fuller for longer.	
food chain	Food chains show what is eaten by different animals.	
oesophagus	A tube made of muscle which chewed food passes through. It connects your mouth to your stomach.	
producer	Plants make their own food using energy from the sun which starts nearly every food chain so they are called <i>producers</i> .	
proteins	Proteins help you grow and build muscle.

	In gymnastics, transferring body weight from one part of the body to another and receiving body weight must be done in a controlled and safe manner. Transferring weight can be used in travelling, jumping, turning and balancing.	In Year 2, you learnt that spinning, turning and twisting movements can be linked to create a sequence.
	Inventing games in a group involves planning and making decisions about how to play the game. You may need to change the rules to make the game more challenging.	In Year 2, you will remember creating a game where you had to beat your own highest score. In Year 3, you will remember having to choose the equipment in your game and how you scored points.
