










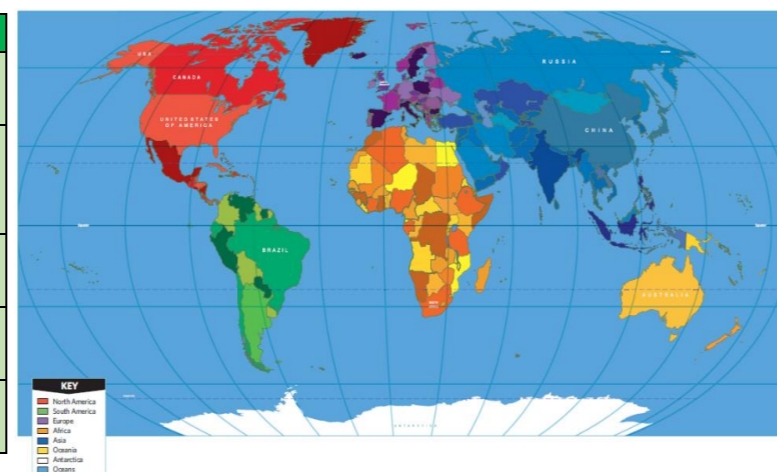

Key Vocabulary	
city	A city in America is an area in which a large number of people live fairly close together.
continent	A continent is one of Earth's seven main divisions of land: Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe and Australia.
country	A country is a nation with its own government occupying a particular territory.
freeway	A freeway is a major road with several lanes that has been specially built for fast travel over long distances.
hemisphere	A hemisphere is half of a sphere (or ball). People use the word to describe one half of Earth.
