













Computing: Key knowledge to be transferred to long term memory

	Computer programs should be built with a specific purpose in mind – for example, a web browser is designed to help people access information on the internet.	In Y4, you learnt that devices such as iPads and laptops can be used to create computer programs.

	As musicians we will learn about:	You will remember:
	Social and cultural differences affect how different compositions are produced and sound, for example, by the types of musical instrument used and the sounds they create.	In Y5, you learnt composition is writing and/or creating a piece of music.

Composing	Creating and developing musical ideas	Home Learning Have you got a favourite female composer? Try researching about their cultural background and what inspired them to have a passion for music.  
Improvise	To make up a tune and play it on the spot.	
Syncopation	Music with lots of rhythmic variety, often quite difficult. The strong beats occur in unexpected places.	

Physical Education: Key knowledge to be transferred to long term memory		
	As athletes we will learn about:	You will remember:
	The muscles and muscle groups needed to create a flexible and stable position – creating a bridge by simultaneously engaging the hamstrings, triceps, and abdominal muscles.	In Y5, you worked in groups and individually developing bridges and points in gymnastics and putting these into a sequence.
	Spatial awareness is important during sport so physical contact is not made with other players, or to gain an advantage within the game.	In Y3, you learnt about the safety procedures that must be followed when carrying out and using equipment such as, javelins and shot put.

	As linguists we will learn about:	You will remember:
	<i>Qu'est-ce qu'il y a au menu ?</i> is French for 'What's on the menu?'	In Y5, you learnt how to say, in French, which foods you enjoyed – <i>j'adore le croissant</i> (I love croissant), <i>je n'aime pas le fromage</i> (I don't like cheese).
