









Science Key knowledge to be transferred to long term memory

	As scientists, we will learn about:	You will remember:
	The body is made up of many different parts. Bodies can vary in size, shape, and colour. e.g. eye colour and hair colour.	In Reception, you learnt the names of basic body parts such as head, nose, ear, arm and leg.
	Our tongue recognises the different tastes: salty, sour, sweet and bitter. Different people prefer different tastes.	In Reception, you tasted lots of different foods to find out what you liked.
	We hear using our ears. Sounds are made when something vibrates.	In Reception, you learnt that you can make loud and quiet sounds with musical instruments.
Key Vocabulary		Home Learning
vibrate	Making tiny, very fast back and forth movements	Make a list of all the sounds that you can hear in your home or garden. Group the sounds into loud sounds and quiet sounds. Think about other ways you could group the sounds. 
senses	These are sight, smell, touch, taste and hearing.	
hearing	Taking in sound through the ear.	
scent	What something smells like.	



Computing Key knowledge to be transferred to long term memory

	As computer operators, we will learn about:	You will remember:
	A password is a secret word that you can use to get on a website. Passwords should not be shared with anyone else.	In Reception, you learnt that you need a password to log in to Purple Mash.
	You must always log out when you have finished your work, so it can be kept safe and cannot be changed by someone else.

avatar	A picture that you can use online instead of your own photograph.	How many icons can you find on a phone, tablet or computer at home? Do you know what the icons are for? 
icon	A picture that you can click on to take you to another page on a website.	
button	An area where you click to make something happen.

	We will learn about:	You will remember:
	Teeth are very strong, but when we eat sugar, it attacks the outside of our teeth and damages them. This can cause something called tooth decay.	In Reception, you learnt that we need to brush our teeth for two minutes, twice a day to keep them clean.

	As designers, we will learn about:	You will remember:
	The three primary colours are red, yellow and blue. These can be mixed to make the three secondary colours of orange, green and purple.	In Reception, you learnt how to mix colours.

blend	To mix colours together smoothly.	Choose a colour. See if you can collect five different objects that have a different shade of the colour you have chosen. 
pattern	When shapes or colours are repeated.	
shade	How dark or light a colour is.

	As musicians, we will learn about:	You will remember:
	Having good posture means stranding or sitting up straight with relaxed shoulders. This can help your body to breathe better when you are singing.	In Reception, you learnt how to sing along with nursery rhymes, such as 'Wind the Bobbin Up' and 'Five Little Ducks'.

expressive	To sing or play an instrument with feeling.

	As athletes, we will learn about:	You will remember:
	Different jumps can be combined to create a pattern of movement. You can travel in different directions by jumping, hopping skipping and bouncing.	In Reception, you learnt how to jump safely onto a mat, by bending your knees and landing on your feet.
	Ball games can involve attacking and defending.	In Reception, you learnt how to work with a partner e.g. throwing a ball.

	The Bible tells Christians how to live their lives. Christians worship in a church and speak to God through prayer.	In Reception you will remember visiting the church where Christian's worship.
