

	The Equator is an imaginary line around the middle of the Earth. Countries closer to the Equator are hotter and those further away are colder.	Earlier in Year 1, you learnt that in the UK, the weather changes during the different seasons. In summer, it is usually warm, and, in the winter, it is usually cold.			An elephant uses its trunk to pick up food, and to touch and explore the world around them. It acts as a fifth limb.
	Pandas live in Asia. They live in bamboo forests and eat bamboo.	Earlier in Year 1, you learnt about the different animals that live in the rainforest, such as a macaw and a sloth. You learnt that a rainforest is very different to where we live.			In the winter, swans, ducks, geese and wading birds migrate to the UK from countries to the north and east because it is warmer, and food is easier to find.
	The continent of Oceania is surrounded by oceans. Lots of fish and sharks live around Oceania.	Earlier in Year 1, we learnt that Oceania is one of the seven continents.			A swallow is a small bird which will usually fly to warmer countries during autumn and return to the UK in spring, when the weather starts to become warmer.
