Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back. We hope you had a lovely Easter holiday. The summer term has arrived, and we will be doing lots of exciting things and taking full advantage of the warmer weather.

Our Topic

Term 5: Let's Look Outside

We will be growing lots of different plants and spending lots of time outside, observing changes and exploring our natural environment.

Maths and English

In maths lessons, children will be continuing to solve addition and subtraction problems up to 10 and begin to recall the number bonds.

In order to support your child, you could play games such as match the number bond pairs, ask them addition and subtraction questions to solve, and practise writing number sentences using the correct symbols. Bring in any work you have been practising at home to your teacher! They would love to see what you have been up to!

In English, we will be learning about: writing letters and diaries, making predictions for stories and using books to find and record factual information.

In order to support your child, you could write a diary about the weekend. You could explore non-fiction books to find out information about nature.

Please encourage your child to read at home every day and ask them questions about what they are reading at every opportunity. We aim to change books regularly.

PΕ

Our PE days are Fridays. Please continue to ensure that your child has the appropriate PE kit. In colder weather, the children need plain black/navy tracksuit bottoms, a plain white t-shirt, a plain sweatshirt and trainers. For warmer weather, the children need plain

black/navy shorts and a plain white t-shirt. Every item needs to be clearly labelled and in a bag that will remain in school every day. Kits will be taken home to be washed at the end of each term. No items should be taken home during the term.

Warmer weather

As the weather is getting warmer, children will need to bring hats into school. Please ensure that these are clearly named. Sunscreen should be applied at home before coming to school. We are not able to assist your child in applying this in school. Your child may bring a water bottle to school. Please ensure the bottle is clearly named and only contains water.

Homework

Homework is sent home on a Friday and will continue to support your child's education. This will have a phonics focus and is linked to what we have been learning about during the week. If there are ever any problems about the homework, please come and see us as soon as possible. It was great to see the children's enthusiasm for their homework last term. We always like to see any activities the children have completed at home. Please encourage your child to bring this in to share with the rest of the class.

Key things that parents can do to support their child this term related to things they will be learning about:

Use natural objects you find outside to design and make a hotel for minibeasts. Place it in your garden and see if any minibeasts come to visit.












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Minibeast Hunt

RECEPTION Make your own bird feeder

Simple Bird Feeder

You will need:

- · Empty cardboard tube
- · Peanut butter
- · Butter knife
- Wild birdseed
- · Tray
- · String (optional)



Instructions

- Using the butter knife, carefully spread a thick layer of peanut butter all over the cardboard tube.
- 2. Pour the birdseed into the tray.
- Roll the peanut butter-covered cardboard tube in the birdseed. Press down carefully to make sure the birdseed has stuck to the peanut butter.
- Gently, shake off the excess birdseed over the tray.
- Slide the birdfeeder onto the branch of a tree.
 Alternatively, you could thread some string through the tube and tie it in a knot at the top to make a loop.
- Sit back and count how many different birds visit your feeder to enjoy a treat!
