What a fantastic start we have had at Kirton Nursery School! The children have enjoyed settling into school life and telling us all about their summer holidays. It has been lovely to see friendships form and routines becoming established. We are very much looking forward to continuing to get to know the children and begin our learning journey together.

Our Theme

This term, we will be exploring the theme '**All About Me**', which gives children the opportunity to learn about themselves and the world around them. Over the coming weeks, we will be learning about our families, our bodies, keeping healthy, our feelings, and the people who help us in our community, such as police officers, doctors, and firefighters.



We'll begin the term by looking at the people who are special to us, using the beautiful book *The Invisible String* as our core text. Through this story, children will learn that love and connection keep us close to those we care about, no matter where we are.



As we move through the term, we'll explore how our bodies work and how we're all unique. With books like *It's Okay to Be Different* and *What Will I Be?* The children will enjoy activities that get them moving and investigating how they use their bodies in different ways.

To round off the term, we'll be learning about oral health. Children will be encouraged to share their experiences of brushing their teeth, and we'll set up a fun dentist role-play area in the nursery. We are very excited about all the learning and fun that lies ahead!

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Here are some more fine motor activities you may wish to explore with your child at home.

Use your fingers to pick off the tape to rescue the toys!



Use your fingers to peel an orange.



Use your fingers to place small objects from around your house to make patterns or pictures.



Use your fingers to poke straws or sticks through the holes in a colander or similar object around your house.
